Scouts Will Climb To New Heights This Summer On The Renovated Climbing Wall

With the leadership of Paul McClain and Chris Moon, Scouts will be soaring to new heights this summer with the completely renovated climbing wall. They were able to add a forth side to the wall and make in enclosed structure that allows for more storage and easy access to all parts of the wall. In addition, the wall was completely "re-skinned" and several challenge elements were added to various sides of the wall. These new elements will be sure to challenge novice and experienced climbers alike. Scouts will also have the chance to enjoy some shade with the new roof that was added too! Several safety, equipment and hardware updates were performed as well. The estimated value of the work if preformed by a contractor is over \$35,000. Funding was made possible by the Art Nodine Memorial Fund, The Douglass Family Foundation, tremendous volunteer support and gifts in kind from United Rentals and Sandford and Hawley Lum-

Major Drainage Project A HUGE Improvement At Camp



Under the leadership of **Bob Wesneski**, a major/ multi-faceted project was completed this winter to help ensure that the waterfront and surrounding area remains in pristine condition for decades to come. The project was completed in several phases to address the run off of water coming down off the hill and would continually wash away the beach, cutting deep trenches into the area. The project addressed the issue by constructing 3 silt ponds in the waterfront area to handle the water from the discharge pipe and the parade ground drainage system. This drainage system is a great im-

provement to the area and is aesthetically pleasing as well. In another phase of the project, large pebble stones were spread at the entrance to the waterfront and a large load of beach sand was dropped off to be spread just prior to the start of the summer camp season.

In addition, two other major areas of camp were improved in the project. The collapsed retaining wall just below the flagpole was rebuilt. Also, the road leading from the maintenance area to the fishing area was recut and fresh gravel was laid down and several drainage issues were addressed.

We are very fortunate to have such a major project completed and will ensure that Scouts for generations will continue to enjoy all that Camp Workcoeman has to offer.
