To provide some kind of Scouting programs to an attempt to fill the void of Scouting experiences, we developed single-day programs on various weekends. Many Citizens of Shawtown members also participated in several workdays with the Ranger at camp to assure our camp was maintained and kept in good repair!

On September 12, 13 we ran "Workcoeman Adventure Days." The program provided opportunities for Scouts BSA to work on merit badges as well as a Discover Scuba program by the CT Scuba Academy. Cub Scouts and their family members participated in fun events including archery, BB shooting, fishing as well as completing Cub Adventure pins. Webelos/Arrow of Light Scouts attended a special event called "Webelos Adventure Days" on September 19, 20. The Scouts completed various adventure pins as they fulfill their rank requirements. Both of the weekend events were SOLD OUT! This is obviously due to the need for Scouting activities.

On October 24 a special "Workcoeman Eagle Experience" is planned. This is an opportunity for those future Eagles to work on requirements for an Eagle related badge and to participate in sessions for them to learn the best process in planning their service project as well as the most effective way to prepare the related paperwork.

We are looking forward to the 2021 camp season. The program features the waiving of the \$50 campsite reservation fee, a \$100 trading post credit, a free tent camping weekend site at any CT Rivers camp and a visit from a member of the Camp Workcoeman staff to an in-person or virtual troop meeting.
